
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
Introduction

Academic Year 2019-2020 highlighted DLSU's continuing transformation as a community of learners and educators. We started the first half of the year on a steady gait, with clear directions on what to accomplish on the second year of our four-year strategic plan that centered on agility, connectedness, and excellence.

From the eruption of Taal Volcano followed by the global outbreak of COVID-19, we had to **pause** operations as we switched to skeleton-crew operations and followed new protocols for the sake of health and safety of our academic community. The period required us to **reset** our policies and procedures to adapt to the new realities created by the pandemic.

Dear Lasallians and Friends,

Some years, we look back to with appreciation and nostalgia. Other years, we shake our heads and ask “How were we able to survive?”. AY 2019-2020 was a mixture of both. It was an academic year that started with a lot of energy and promise as we set out on the second year of our strategic plan 2019-2023. That plan included steps we were taking in preparation for the possible disruptions that the fourth industrial revolution was bringing about in different areas of social, economic, and academic life.

The first trimester brought out the best in us in terms of faculty achievements in research, events and competitions sponsored by private and government organizations. Our students too excelled in different fields and disciplines, academic, socio-cultural, community engagement, and athletics.

And then came the major events that overturned our plans, and uprooted us from our time-tested modes of teaching and learning. First, the eruption of Taal Volcano. Soon after, COVID 19. Their effects went beyond provinces and cities, but the country as a whole. In fact, COVID 19 afflicted our whole planet, and we are not yet into the “new normal” because we are still trying to understand the virus, find a vaccine, and counteract the different effects of the pandemic.

If I were to describe the year, I would use the computer keys: “PAUSE / STOP” and “RESET”. As an academic community we had to bring operations to almost a complete halt, switch to skeleton-crew operations following new protocols for the sake of health and safety of our academic community. But we have a Mission Continuity Plan to guide us. And we put into operation a Mission Continuity Working Committee to deal with the new challenges. Our Academics Council devoted hours of online meetings to work out options for blended, fully online, or full face-to-face modalities of teaching-learning. Our administrative units also worked hard to shift to “work from home”, online transactions (for student services, accounting, approval of different requests, etc.)

So there was a “pause” in operations, and we “reset” our policies and procedures to adapt to the new realities created by the pandemic. I am proud to say, the Lasallian values we have referred to in our discussions, planning meetings, retreats and recollections were the basis for our responses: faith, that the Lord had not abandoned us, but continued to support and inspire us, more often than not in our care and concern for each other. Zeal for service and the mission motivated our willingness to sacrifice our time and convenience, and for some, even risk health and safety to carry out essential services for those entrusted to our care: students, family members, needy neighbors... The ingrained value of community surfaced in the spirit of cooperation, availability and creativity in finding and implementing answers to the challenges brought about by COVID 19.





The University consistently outperformed other private higher education institutions (HEIs) in the country in terms of Scopus-indexed research produced. This has contributed to the University's regular inclusion in the Times Higher Education World University Rankings' selection of the top 1,500 institutions out of an estimated 26,000 HEIs around the world.

It requires a threshold number of Scopus publications, combined with data on teaching, innovation, international outlook, and reputation, to be included in the THE Rankings list. DLSU's inclusion in the rankings underscores the University's commitment to contribute to the country's development through research, especially in this time of pandemic.






DLSU remains the most productive in research among the country's private higher education institutions.








External Linkages and Internationalization







This is our Lasallian response.



The extraordinary times that pushed the academic sector to provide innovative solutions to the delivery of quality education further highlighted DLSU's digital transformation called the BITUIN Project. BITUIN stands for **Banner Initiative to Transform, Unify, Integrate, and Navigate**.

BITUIN's flagship initiative Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system is a three-year project involving financial management, human resources management, and student life cycle. It means rationalizing and improving access to information, streamlining processes so that they are most efficient to users, and enhancing services for all stakeholders and members of the academic community.





The team behind the BITUIN Project, which implements an Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) System, shared the latest developments to improve access to information, streamline processes, and enhance services involving the University's key stakeholders.

Focusing on the areas of financial management, student life cycle, and human resource, the Bituin Project team undertook development activities related to data, technical, systems, user, and production readiness.

The team conducted online parallel activities, including key user training, user acceptance testing, and end-user training. These activities involved collaboration among the key users and technical working groups, composed of university administrators and the office workforce.

Vendor representatives and project team members facilitated the development of the workflow process aimed at simplifying and enhancing the stakeholders' experience.

For detailed step-by-step processes involved in accomplishing a specific output, the workflow called L4 and L5 Processes were developed. (L1-L3 Processes present a general view of the workflow.) The L4 process maps were documented and approved by the Technical Working Group across all domains.

Likewise, the team undertook data harmonization activities, particularly data cleanup and data migration for domains in preparation for Key User Training/User Acceptance Testing activities.

To help users focus on higher work and execute tasks efficiently, the BITUIN project introduced an Enterprise Service Bus, a tool that connects different applications. At the same time, it also reported the ongoing development of the Business Process Management Software, aimed at lessening day-to-day manual tasks through automation based on the set business processes.

Meanwhile, the Finance and HR Domains are currently conducting their respective Key User Training. Finance domain training highlights include accounts payables and receivables, asset management, procurement, collections, and expense report. Meanwhile, the Human Resource domain tackles, among others, employee induction, benefits, time, and attendance.

The Student Lifecycle domain conducted their training session ahead of schedule. The User Acceptance Testing (Phase 1-A) focused on Enrollment concerns such as schedules, course registration, and adjustments, fees validation, and course offerings.
